## **ENRICHMENT PROGRAMMES & ACTIVITIES FOR PRIMARY 6 (POST-PSLE)**

In an effort to engage **ALL** our P6 students with meaningful activities as they conclude their primary school experience with the school, we have organised several activities for them. Most of these activities would be conducted during the curriculum time.

There are two attachments to this letter. The first is a brief write-up of the enrichment programmes and activities. It includes information about the value of these activities, and when they will be conducted. The second attachment is the schedule of the Dance, Digital Art, African Drum and ICT Baseline programme.

The school will co-pay for most of the programmes/activities to support the students' learning. However, there will be no refund once students have signed up for the programmes/activities.
